ELIGIBILITY

The Northern Texas PGA Junior Golf Foundation is open to junior golfers ages 7–18 who are not currently attending college. Players are eligible to play in an NTPGA event until their 19th birthday. A player’s age division is based on their age as of the day of the tournament.

FOUNDATION AREAS AND TOUR LEVELS

The Foundation’s summer tournament series is known as the Northern Texas PGA Ewing Automotive Junior Tour. The NTPGA Ewing Automotive Junior Tour’s non-invitational events are open to all 2010 Foundation members.

The Foundation also conducts the Spring Break Series, Cowboys Series and All American Tour.

The Northern Texas PGA Junior Golf Foundation is separated into three areas: East, Metro and West. Members may play in a variety of areas and tour levels throughout the year.

EAST TEXAS

(includes Athens, Canton, Longview, Palestine, Texarkana, Tyler, etc.)

◆ Ewing Automotive GMC Medalist Tour

The East Texas Ewing Automotive GMC Medalist Tour is for members ages 7–18 with beginning level and average tournament experience, offers 9-hole (ages 7–11) and 18-hole (ages 12–18) individual stroke play competitions.

WEST TEXAS

(includes Abilene, Amarillo, Brownwood, Lubbock, Midland, Odessa, San Angelo, etc.)

◆ Ewing Automotive GMC Medalist Tour

The West Texas Ewing Automotive GMC Medalist Tour is for members ages 7–18 with beginning level and average tournament experience, offers 9-hole (ages 7–11) and 18-hole (ages 12–18) individual stroke play competitions.

METRO AREA

(includes Dallas/Fort Worth metroplex, Sherman, Temple, Waco, Wichita Falls, etc.)

◆ Ewing Automotive Buick Prep Tour

The Metro Ewing Automotive Buick Prep Tour is for members ages 7–18 with beginning level golf experience, offers 9-hole individual stroke play competitions.

◆ **Ewing Automotive GMC Medalist Tour**

The Ewing Automotive GMC Medalist Tour is for members ages 12–18 with average tournament experience, offers 18-hole individual stroke play competitions.

◆ **Ewing Autohaus Mercedes-Benz Masters Tour**

The Ewing Autohaus Mercedes-Benz Masters Tour is for members ages 12–18 with average tournament experience and ability, offers 18–hole individual stroke play competitions.

◆ **Ewing Automotive All American Tour**

The Ewing Automotive All American Tour is for members with a moderate to high level of tournament experience and ability. This tour offers two day, 36-hole individual stroke play competitions for members ages 12-18 and two day, 18-hole individual stroke play competitions for members ages 7-11.

SUGGESTED GUIDELINES FOR SELECTING A TOUR LEVEL

Members will have the right to place themselves in any tour level at the beginning of the season. However, the Foundation reserves the right to place members in certain Ewing Automotive Junior Tour levels based on their performance.

It is suggested that members (both boys and girls) use the following guidelines when selecting Tour Levels:

<u>Average Score (9 holes) / (18 holes)</u>	<u>Tour Level</u>
Higher than (50) / (100)	Prep Tour
Lower than (50) / (100)	Medalist and Masters Tours
Lower than (45) / (90)	All American Tour

If during the play of any Metro Medalist or Masters tournament a player shoots higher than 120 in two (2) events during the series (i.e. Ewing Automotive Junior Tour), that player may be re-assigned to the Metro Prep Tour for the rest of that series. If during the play of any All American Tour event a player's 36-hole score is higher than 210; two (2) times, that player may be re-assigned to the Medalist and Masters Tour.

ENTRY PROCEDURES

Entries for all non-invitational tournaments conducted by the Northern Texas PGA Junior Golf Foundation during the summer may be mailed no earlier than Monday, May 3rd. On-line entries will be accepted starting at 12:01 a.m. Monday, May 3rd. There is no limit to the number of events members can enter. Any entry (entries) postmarked before May 3rd will not be accepted and will be returned.

NOTE: The Northern Texas PGA will stop accepting entries for an event once the tournament is full or five (5) days prior to the event, regardless of whether or not the event is full. Should a tournament have openings within the five (5) day window, members are encouraged to walk-up

to the tournament the day of the event. Walk-up entries will be subject to a \$15.00 processing fee.

- ◆ Members will be placed in the age group according to their age as of the date of the tournament (unless they have declared “up” to a higher age level). NOTE: Should you qualify for the Area or Tour Championship in one age group, however as of the Area or Tour Championship you are in an older age group you will be required to compete in the older age group.
- ◆ Members must register online or use the official tournament entry form located on the Foundation’s website to register for events.
- ◆ Entries submitted via phone or email will not be accepted.
- ◆ Correct payment must accompany entry forms in order to be processed. Incorrect payment will result in the entry form being delayed.
- ◆ Confirmation emails will be sent out to each member submitting an entry form confirming the tournaments they were accepted into or otherwise.

TOUR REFUND POLICY AND WITHDRAWALS

All cancellations and withdrawals must be submitted online or through the Foundation office utilizing the automated cancellation line. Cancellations can be made online by accessing your account on the main page of the Foundation’s website. The cancellation line can be accessed 24 hours a day by calling the Foundation office at (214) 420-7421 and asking for the cancellation line. If calling after hours or on the weekend, simply listen to the voicemail for instructions to be transferred to the cancellation line. Refunds will be granted until 11:59 p.m. five (5) days prior to the scheduled event. Example: If an event is on June 10, you must withdraw by 11:59 p.m. on June 5. No refunds will be granted for cancellations and withdrawals after this time. In case of medical or family emergencies, written requests for refunds must be submitted to the Foundation office no more than seven (7) days after the completion of the event. Each request will be considered separately on its own merit. Refund Request Forms are available on the main page of the Foundation’s website under the Forms and Documents heading. NOTE: For Prep and Medalist events, all refunds are subject to a \$5.00 processing fee. For Masters and All American events, all refunds are subject to a \$10.00 processing fee.

TOURNAMENT CANCELLATION PROCEDURE

The Foundation reserves the right to cancel tournaments in the event of inclement weather or other incidents. The NTPGA recommends checking the status of the tournament by viewing the Foundation’s website or calling the NTPGA or host facility the morning of the event. If a tournament is cancelled, members scheduled to participate in the event will be refunded the full entry fee to their account. If the tournament is cancelled during play, the Foundation reserves the right to retain the full entry fee.

ON-SITE CHECK-IN POLICY

If a tournament is using a shotgun start, all participants must check-in or be in line to check-in 30 minutes prior to the scheduled start of the tournament.

EXAMPLE: If a tournament is scheduled to begin with an 8:00 a.m. shotgun, a participant must be checked-in (or in line to check-in) by 7:30 a.m. Otherwise, the Foundation reserves the right to cancel the participant's registration and use it for a walk-up participant. If you arrive after the registration window has closed, you will be added to the bottom of the walk up list and put into the tournament on a space available basis. You are not guaranteed entry into the tournament if you miss the registration window. If you do not get into the tournament you will be given a refund less the cancellation fee.

If a tournament is using a tee time start, all participants must be checked-in and at their designated starting hole at their assigned starting time.

NOTE: Prompt attendance is required of all players and time of starting penalties shall be consistent with Rule 6-3 and the Note to Rule 6-3 in the USGA Rules of Golf. Each contestant is responsible for obtaining his/her starting time.

WALK-UP POLICY

Walk-up lists will be used to place members into events that they were not otherwise entered for. The list will begin the morning of the event when the NTPGA staff or official in charge arrives approximately an hour and a half before the scheduled start of the event. No other list should be signed or circulated until the NTPGA staff or official in charge starts the official walk-up list the day of the event. Any such list will be disregarded.

Members on the walk-up list will replace no-shows on a first-come, first-served basis within the applicable age group. Members, if placed in the tournament, must pay the appropriate entry fee on site or have an account credit with the NTPGA that will cover tournament fees; without sufficient funds players will be denied entry. The NTPGA does not guarantee that signing the walk-up list will ensure a spot in the tournament. Anyone walking up to an event will be subject to an additional \$15.00 processing fee.

BREAKING TIES

In all Prep and Medalist Tour events, ties for first, second and third place in all age divisions will be broken by a score card playoff. In all Masters Tour events, ties for second and third place in all divisions will be broken by a score card playoff. The NTPGA official policy for breaking ties via a score card playoff is the same as defined by the USGA in Appendix I. The method of matching score cards to determine the winner will begin by using the last nine (9) holes of the tournament. If the players have the same score for the last nine (9), we will use the last six (6) holes, last three (3) holes and finally the 18th hole. If this method is used in a competition with a multiple tee start, it is recommended that the "last nine holes, last six holes, etc." is considered to be holes 10-18, 13-18, etc. If after proceeding with this method the winner has yet to be determined, we will continue on by comparing score cards from the 17th hole and continuing backwards by comparing the 16th hole, 15th hole, etc. until a winner has been determined. In Masters Tour events all ties, for first place only, will be decided by a sudden-death play-off. At All American Tour events all ties for first, second and third place in all age divisions will be broken using a sudden-death play-off.

NO SHOWS & NO CARDS

It is the responsibility of the participant to notify the Foundation office when canceling out of a tournament. When canceling on the day of the tournament, members must notify the Foundation by canceling online or using the cancellation line. Any member who does not will be considered a “No Show.”

All participants must return their score card to the scoring area immediately following play. Any participant who fails to return their score card after the round will be considered a “No Card” and will be deemed to have taken the nine (9) stroke limit on each hole. Participants withdrawing during play of an event **MUST** return their score card to the scoring area and notify a Foundation official before leaving the facility; otherwise, they will be considered as a “No Card” participant.

DECLARING UP

Members may declare up to an older age division, which may allow them to play in an event not otherwise open to them. If a member declares up, he/she must play in the older age division for the entire series (Ewing Automotive Junior Tour, Spring Break Series, Cowboys Series, All American) and must play by the applicable rules and regulations of that tournament. **NOTE:** A player may not compete in two different age divisions when competing in different tournament series. Example: A player cannot compete in the Girls 12-14 during All American Tour events and Girls 15-18 in Masters Tour events. In order to declare up, members must complete the Foundation’s Age Division Declaration Form which is available on the main page of the Foundation’s website under the Forms and Documents heading.

RULES OF PLAY

USGA Rules of Golf shall govern all play, including local rules on the Notice to Competitors, which is distributed at every event on the back of the tournament score card. The following are Foundation Rules of Play (unless otherwise stated).

EWING AUTOMOTIVE BUICK PREP TOUR

- ◆ Play is governed by the USGA Rules of Golf and its Decisions.
- ◆ Play the ball as it lies.
- ◆ The new USGA condition of competition requiring a player’s clubs conform to the groove and punch mark specifications as detailed in the 2010-2011 Rules of Golf is **NOT** in effect.
- ◆ Players may have one caddie to carry their bag and equipment and give advice, but all players must walk the golf course. Participants and their equipment cannot be transported in motorized carts, except when going to their first hole or when returning from the last hole played.
- ◆ The NTPGA permits pull carts, however they will be allowed only at the discretion of the host facility. It is the players’ responsibility to obtain course policy.
- ◆ Participants may have spectators and parents assist in keeping their score. All scores need to be recorded on Foundation score cards.
- ◆ Participants must exchange score cards with fellow competitors in the group.

-
- ◆ Any player who has taken nine (9) strokes on any hole and has not holed out must pick up his/her ball and proceed to the next tee. The score must be recorded as a nine (9) and does not exclude the participant from award consideration.
 - ◆ Parents and spectators may interact with the participants, search for golf balls and help keep score while maintaining a sufficient pace of play.
 - ◆ Upon completion of the round, players must immediately proceed to the scoring area to return their score card. Participants are responsible for the correct hole-by-hole score and two signatures on the score card.
 - ◆ Participants are responsible for knowing the Rules of Play and Notice to Competitors listed on the back of the score card.
 - ◆ Pace of Play: Participants and spectators must keep up with the group in front of them at all times.
 - ◆ Players must NOT use any artificial device or unusual equipment for the purpose of gauging or measuring distance or conditions that might affect his play.
 - ◆ Players must NOT wear headphones during play.
 - ◆ Allow NTPGA staff and officials to administer rulings. Spectators will be brought into a situation ONLY if the staff member or official asks for assistance.
 - ◆ When on the course, spectators and players must turn off cell phones or turn ringers to the silent or vibrate mode. Respect host facility's policy if cell phones are not allowed.

**EWING AUTOMTOIVE GMC MEDALIST TOUR &
EWING AUTOHAUS MERCEDES-BENZ MASTERS TOUR**

- ◆ Play is governed by the USGA Rules of Golf and its Decisions.
 - ◆ Play the ball as it lies.
 - ◆ The new USGA condition of competition requiring a player's clubs conform to the groove and punch mark specifications as detailed in the 2010-2011 Rules of Golf is NOT in effect.
 - ◆ Participants must walk and carry their own equipment. Caddies are NOT permitted.
 - ◆ Participants and their equipment cannot be transported in a motorized cart, except when going to their first hole or when returning from the last hole played.
 - ◆ The NTPGA permits pull carts, however they will be allowed only at the discretion of the host facility. It is the players' responsibility to obtain course policy.
 - ◆ Participants must exchange score cards with fellow competitors in the group.
 - ◆ Any player who has taken nine (9) strokes on any hole and has not holed out must pick up his/her ball and proceed to the next tee. The score must be recorded as a nine (9) and does not exclude the participant from award consideration.
 - ◆ Parents may interact with participants. However, "Advice" (any counsel or suggestion which could influence a player in determining his play, the choice of a club or the method of making a stroke) is not permitted. Any breach of Rule 8-1 (Advice) may result in a penalty and/or disqualification.
 - ◆ Upon completion of the round, players must immediately proceed to the scoring area to return their score card. Participants are responsible for the correct hole-by-hole score and two signatures on the score card.
 - ◆ Participants are responsible for knowing the Rules of Play and Notice to Competitors listed on the back of the score card.

- ◆ Pace of Play: Participants must keep up with the group in front of them. Any group falling out of position (defined as a hole open) may be warned and timed. Subsequent violations may result in penalties and/or disqualification.
 - ◆ The player must NOT use any artificial device or unusual equipment for the purpose of gauging or measuring distance or conditions that might affect his play.
 - ◆ Players must NOT wear headphones during play.
 - ◆ Allow NTPGA staff and officials to administer rulings. Spectators will be brought into a situation ONLY if the staff member or official asks for assistance.
 - ◆ When on the course, spectators and players must turn off cell phones or turn ringers to the silent or vibrate mode. Respect host facility's policy if cell phones are not allowed.

EWING AUTOMOTIVE ALL AMERICAN TOUR

- ◆ Play is governed by the USGA Rules of Golf and its Decisions.
 - ◆ Play the ball as it lies.
 - ◆ The new USGA condition of competition requiring a player's clubs conform to the groove and punch mark specifications as detailed in the 2010-2011 Rules of Golf is NOT in effect.
 - ◆ Participants ages 12-18 must walk and carry their own equipment. Participants ages 7-11 may have one caddie to carry their bag and give advice. Participants and their equipment cannot be transported in a motorized cart, except when authorized by the Rules Committee.
 - ◆ The NTPGA permits pull carts, however they will be allowed only at the discretion of the host facility. It is the players' responsibility to obtain course policy.
 - ◆ Participants must exchange score cards with fellow competitors in the group.
 - ◆ Any player in the 7-11 age divisions who has taken nine (9) strokes on any hole and has not holed out must pick up his/her ball and proceed to the next tee. The score must be recorded as a nine (9) and does not exclude the participant from award consideration.
 - ◆ Parents may interact with participants. However, "Advice" (any counsel or suggestion which could influence a player in determining his play, the choice of a club or the method of making a stroke) is not permitted. Any breach of Rule 8-1 (Advice) may result in a penalty and/or disqualification.
 - ◆ Upon completion of the round, players must immediately proceed to the scoring area to return their score card. Participants are responsible for the correct hole-by-hole score and two signatures on the score card.
 - ◆ Participants are responsible for knowing the Rules of Play and Notice to Competitors listed on the back of the score card.
 - ◆ Pace of Play: Participants must keep up with the group in front of them. Any group falling out of position (defined as a hole open) may be warned and timed. Subsequent violations may result in penalties and/or disqualification.
 - ◆ The player must NOT use any artificial device or unusual equipment for the purpose of gauging or measuring distance or conditions that might affect his play.
 - ◆ Players must NOT wear headphones during play.
 - ◆ Allow NTPGA staff and officials to administer rulings. Spectators will be brought into a situation ONLY if the staff member or official asks for assistance.
 - ◆ When on the course, spectators and players must turn off cell phones or turn ringers to the silent or vibrate mode. Respect host facility's policy if cell phones are not allowed.

ARRANGEMENT OF STARTING TIMES & GROUPINGS

Starting times and pairings for all Prep, Medalist, Masters and All American Tour events will be done on a blind draw, based on age group and gender, or as otherwise determined by the NTPGA Junior Golf Foundation. For each event the Northern Texas PGA will pair the top 1/3 of the division based on their NTPGA scoring average over the last twelve (12) months. For the second round of the Tour Championship and All American Tour events, players will be re-paired based on their scores from round one.

For all events, requests for starting times or specific groupings will not be accommodated. Players shall start at the time and the order arranged unless otherwise informed by the Rules Committee. Prompt attendance is required of all players at their starting point of each round. Time of starting penalties shall be consistent with Rule 6-3 and the Note to Rule 6-3 in the USGA Rules of Golf. Each contestant is responsible for obtaining his/her starting time.

SPECTATOR GUIDELINES

The NTPGA Junior Golf Foundation encourages spectators to attend tournaments. However, the Foundation requires all spectators to conduct themselves appropriately at all times.

- ◆ Spectators should stay one shot ahead of the group they are following. This allows spectators to follow errant shots and help identify where golf balls come to rest.
- ◆ Spectators are allowed to aid in the search for lost golf balls.
- ◆ Spectators should not give rulings, please seek an NTPGA rules official if the need arises.
- ◆ Spectators should stay on cart paths. In the absence of cart paths, spectators should stay in the rough. Please stay off fairways, tees and greens.
- ◆ Spectators are allowed to carry medicine, drinks, food umbrellas, etc. for players.

The USGA Rules of Golf states, “Advice is any counsel or suggestion which could influence a player in determining his play, the choice of club or method of making a stroke.” The breach of Rule 8-1 (Advice) is a penalty of two strokes. With this statement in mind, please keep conversations with the player to words of encouragement only.

The Northern Texas PGA Junior Golf Foundation reserves the right to suspend and/or ban any spectator from one or more events. Failure to comply with the stated spectator guidelines may result in the immediate removal from the host facility and/or suspension of playing privileges for the Foundation member.

SPECTATOR GOLF CARTS

Spectator golf carts will be available at the discretion of the host facility; it is the players’ responsibility to obtain the course policy. If spectator golf carts are permissible:

- ◆ Players may not ride or have their golf clubs transported in golf carts except when being transported to their starting hole, back to the clubhouse from their finishing hole, during a suspension of play or when authorized by the Rules Committee.

-
- ◆ Spectator carts must remain on the cart path at all times.
 - ◆ Only two riders are allowed in a golf cart at one time.

CADDIE POLICY

When caddies are permitted, each player may have one caddie to carry their equipment and give advice. However, the Foundation requires all caddies to conduct themselves appropriately at all times.

- ◆ Caddies may not ride or have golf clubs transported in golf carts except when being transported to their starting hole, back to the clubhouse from their finishing hole, during a suspension of play or when authorized by the Rules Committee.
- ◆ Proper dress attire is required of all caddies. Each host facility may have additional rules and dress code requirements that must be adhered to by all caddies. Proper attire includes collared shirts or mock turtlenecks (host golf course permitting), slacks, shorts, tennis shoes, caps and visors. Should a golf course have a stricter dress code, its policy will take precedence. The dress code prohibits denim, short shorts, cut-offs, swimsuits, sandals, clothing containing offensive slogans, language or pictures, clothing describing or advertising alcohol, tobacco, or other drug references.
- ◆ The use of smoking or chewing tobacco products and alcohol by caddies is not permitted.

The Northern Texas PGA Junior Golf Foundation reserves the right to suspend and/or ban any caddie from one or more events. Failure to comply with the stated caddie guidelines may result in the immediate removal from the host facility and/or suspension of playing privileges for the Foundation member.

GOLF GALAXY PLAYER OF THE YEAR POINTS CHALLENGE

The following divisions will earn points throughout the entire year for the Golf Galaxy Player of the Year Points Challenge. Any points earned within an age division will stay in that age division for the entire year, and any points earned within a Chapter will stay in that Chapter for the entire year. Example: If a player earns points as a 13 year old in the Boys 12-13 division during the Spring Break series, but will turn 14 in May and plays in the Boys 14-15 division for the rest of the year, that player has earned points in two (2) separate divisions. Those points WILL NOT carry over from one division to the next, regardless of whether or not the player had a birthday or declared “up”.

- ◆ All East Texas Medalist divisions
- ◆ All West Texas Medalist divisions
- ◆ Metro Prep ages 7-11 only
- ◆ All Metro Medalist divisions
- ◆ All Metro Masters divisions
- ◆ All All American Tour divisions

The Northern Texas PGA Junior Golf Foundation employs a weighted points system to determine the Golf Galaxy Player of the Year. The method is commonly referred to as the 6/12 divisor and it works by dividing the total number of points earned by the number of tournaments played with a minimum of 6 and a maximum of 12. What this means is that if a player has played 6 or fewer tournaments, their point total will be divided by 6. Example: A player earned 300 points through the first 5 events, that player's points will equal 50.0 (300 points divided by 6 events). When the player plays a number of tournaments between 6 and 12, their total points will be divided by the actual number of events played. Example: A player has earned 640 points through 8 events, their point total will be 80.0 (640 points divided by 8 events). Finally when a player plays in at least 12 events, their point total will always be divided by 12 regardless of the number of events in which the player has played.

Due to the limited number of events on the All American Tour, the Foundation will employ the same system using a 3/6 divisor to calculate points.

NOTE: Player of the Year points will be distributed equally amongst ties within the top 10 except for first place. First place finishers in all divisions will receive first place points.

NOTE: Player of the Year points at the Area and Tour Championships will be increased for each place by 50% and 100% respectively.

CODE OF CONDUCT

The NTPGA Junior Golf Foundation takes great pride in the quality and conduct of its players, host facilities, and sponsors. The Foundation requires all members to adhere to a set of guidelines known as the Code of Conduct. The purpose is to help all Foundation participants grow and mature by understanding and accepting the consequences of their actions, both on and off the golf course.

-
1. Violations of the Code of Conduct include, but are not limited to: abusive language, club throwing, cheating, disrespect of volunteers, officials and host staff, abuse of the golf course, use of smoking or chewing tobacco products, drugs or alcohol, not adhering to the dress code, leaving the course during a competitive round without permission of a Foundation official, or any other conduct deemed unbecoming of a Foundation member.
 2. Proper attire is required at all times at Foundation events. Failure to comply may result in disqualification. Each host facility may have additional rules and dress code requirements that must be adhered to by all Foundation members and spectators. Proper attire includes collared shirts or mock turtlenecks (host golf course permitting), slacks, shorts, golf or tennis shoes, caps and visors. Should a golf course have a stricter dress code, its policy will take precedence. It is also suggested that participants wear sunscreen. The dress code prohibits denim, short shorts, cut-offs, swimsuits, sandals, clothing containing offensive slogans, language or pictures, clothing describing or advertising alcohol, tobacco, or other drug references. The Foundation strongly suggests participants present themselves in a positive manner while representing the NTPGA by wearing hats with the brim forward, tucking in all shirts, and removing any earrings (males).

The NTPGA Junior Golf Foundation Committee may assess any or all of the following penalties based on the severity of the Code of Conduct violation:

- a) Issue a verbal or written letter of warning to the player and his/her parent/guardian.
- b) Enforce a two-stroke penalty.
- c) Disqualify the player from the tournament where the violation occurs.
- d) Suspend the player for a portion of the series or the remainder of the series and/or year.
- e) Suspend the player's membership indefinitely.

ASSUMPTION OF RISK

By entering and competing in a Northern Texas PGA Junior Golf Foundation sanctioned tournament, you assume all risk and danger incidental to the game of golf and release Northern Texas PGA Junior Golf Foundation sanctioned tournaments and competitions and their host sites, sponsors, host organizations, Northern Texas PGA, participating players, and all agents thereof from any and all liabilities resulting from such cases.

You grant permission to the Northern Texas PGA to utilize your image or likeness incidental to any live or recorded television or other transmission or reproduction in whole or in part of any Northern Texas PGA event you attend. You agree not to transmit or facilitate transmission of any account, description, picture, or reproduction of any Northern Texas PGA event, including, without limitation, scoring related data, without the specific advance written permission of the Northern Texas PGA.

GRIEVANCE COMMITTEE

In the event of a suspension, the player may submit a written account of the Code of Conduct violation to the Foundation Grievance Committee within seven (7) days of the suspension /

disqualification. The Grievance Committee will review all submitted materials, including a tournament staff account of the violation. The NTPGA Executive Director and Junior Golf Committee Chairman will review grievances. All grievances must go through the appropriate channels to be considered.

ACCOMMODATIONS FOR JUNIOR GOLFERS WITH DISABILITIES OR CHRONIC HEALTH CONDITIONS

The NTPGA will, at its sole discretion and upon receipt of applicable medical documentation, make reasonable accommodations for junior golfers with disabilities or chronic health conditions. Subject to applicable rules established by the host site, reasonable accommodations may include the use of a pull cart or motorized golf cart for the transportation of golf clubs and competitors during junior tour events. All related inquiries and communications shall be directed to the Executive Director.

MISCELLANEOUS

- ◆ It is the responsibility of the participant to know the host facility rules and regulations. The Foundation abides by all host facility rules and regulations and requires that all participants and spectators do the same.
- ◆ It is the responsibility of the participant (grades 9–12) to know the University Interscholastic League (UIL) regulations and abide by them.
- ◆ The Foundation will charge a \$35.00 fee for any returned and/or non-sufficient fund checks. Playing privileges may be suspended until all fees are sufficiently paid.



Previous cancellation deadline was 7 days prior to the event at 5:00 p.m.

Suggested Guidelines for Selecting a Tour Level:

- Suggested average score for the Masters Tour is now the same as the Medalist Tour which is lower than 100 on 18 holes.
- Suggested average score for the All American Tour is lower than 90 on 18 holes and lower than 50 on 9 holes.

Rules of Play Changes:

- The new USGA condition of competition requiring a player's clubs conform to the groove and punch mark specifications as detailed in the 2010-2011 Rules of Golf is NOT in effect.
- Players must NOT wear headphones during play.

All American Tour:

- The All American Tour is designed for players with a moderate to high skill level and tournament experience and offers 18-hole stroke play competitions for players ages 7-11 and 36-hole stroke play competitions for players ages 12-18. All American Tour events will be conducted over two days.
- After play of any All American Tour event a player's 36-hole score is higher than 210, two (2) times, that player may be re-assigned to the Medalist and Masters Tour.

Masters Tour:

- The 9-stroke limit will now be in effect for all age divisions at Masters Tour events.
- A first place finish on the Masters Tour is no longer equivalent to winning two events on the Medalist Tour towards qualifying for the Tour Championship.

Tournament Field Sizes:

- Prep Tour: 48 player max at registration deadline / 55 player max on site.
- Medalist Tour: 100 player max at registration deadline / 110 player max on site.

Age Divisions and Declaring Up:

- All players will be assigned a division based on their date of birth and gender at the time of registration. Player age divisions will be manually updated if their birthday results in a change in age division. Any other changes to a player's age division must be done by using the Age Division Declaration Form located under the Forms and Documents heading on the Foundation website. All requests for declaring up in age division will need to be approved by the NTPGA and will be handled on a case by case basis.

Breaking Ties:

- In all Masters Tour events, ties for second and third place in all divisions will be broken by a score card playoff. Ties for first place only will be decided by a sudden-death play-off.
- In all All American Tour events, ties for first, second and third place in all divisions will be decided by a sudden-death play-off.

Player of the Year:

- Player of the year points earned on the Masters Tour will now apply to the Metro Player of the Year Points Challenge. The Metro Player of the Year Points Challenge will still utilize the 6/12 divisor rule.
- The East Chapter Player of the Year Points Challenge will now use the 6/12 divisor to calculate points instead of the 4/8 divisor.
- Player of the year points earned on the All American Tour will only apply to the All American Tour Player of the Year Points Challenge. The All American Tour Player of the Year Points Challenge will utilize a 3/6 divisor to calculate points.

East Area Championship:

- The top two (2) finishers (previously three) and ties in each age division of East Texas Medalist Tour events will automatically qualify for the East Area Championship.
- Any player finishing in the top ten (10) on the Player of the Year Points list (as of July 30, 2010), who is not otherwise qualified, will receive an exemption into the Ewing Automotive East Area Championship.
- Any player finishing in the top five (5) on the All American Tour Player of the Year Points list (as of July 30, 2010), who is not otherwise qualified, will receive an exemption into their respective Area Championship.

West Area Championship:
